It is stated simply and succinctly in our mission that we follow the example of Jesus Christ and serve ALL PEOPLE. Jesus served people one at time while HE walked on this earth, and the example has been set for us. Here are just a few of the community impacts from 2023:

- » 20,863 members
- **» 3,526** children served in childcare programming
- » 2,811 people learned how to swim
- » 2,485 kids in our youth sports programs
- » 1,708 youth served in our Outreach programs
- » 1,479 campers attending our summer camps
- » Over 800 individuals investing in our community by donating

Thank you so much to the amazing staff and team-members who make these numbers possible, but it is worth noting, that our programs at the YMCA are not about numbers, not about statistics, but ultimately they are about PEOPLE. Each number represented above is a face, a name, and a story that is impacted. With a mission to serve ALL PEOPLE, we have to be available to meet people where they are. In 2023, we took two big steps towards being accessible to more people. We celebrated the grand re-opening of the CenterPoint Energy YMCA last summer and construction is currently underway at the Toyota Indiana YMCA in Princeton. So many great partners are helping to make those two projects possible, but we certainly want to specifically thank CenterPoint Energy and Toyota Motor Manufacturing Indiana. These two facilities are great additions to our other community branches, but the facilities are just the beginning, as our mission is serving the PEOPLE that come through the doors.

Personally, my favorite part of being part of the YMCA is learning about the impact a staff member or volunteer has had on an individual's life. In many cases, this opportunity to serve builds relationships that last a lifetime. Your YMCA has the highest of expectations for the PEOPLE in our community and based on that, we dream big dreams and pray big prayers for each person we serve. With those dreams in our heads and those prayers in our hearts, I feel confident in saying that 2023 was a great year at the YMCA, but our best days are yet to come.

Having been a YMCA member since 1979, and visited Ys across the country, Tinsley Northington has experienced a lot of what the Y has to offer. The word that he used most when talking about living a resilient life, working out, and being part of the YMCA was "blessed". His perspective is a valuable one that we can learn a lot from.

"I am blessed to have another day alive and have the relationships at the YMCA. The people inspire me to keep going," he says about his YMCA community.

He shared, "I am blessed to have been where I was when it (cardiac arrest) happened, where there are

trained people ready to respond," referring to that difficult day last year at the Ascension St. Vincent YMCA when he was resuscitated by YMCA staff, trained and ready.

Not long into his recovery, and with doctor's permission, he was back at the Y getting after it with just as much consistency as before, back into his routine. "The key is to be consistent no matter what is going on in your life. You can take breaks, but not so long that you don't want to get back at it."

Members like Tinsley are routinely doing the work to stay or get healthy and our staff is staying trained up and ready to keep the YMCA a safe place for all. This community is special and Tinsley reminds us of why we do what we do.

Tinsley also understands the value of having a healthy Spirit, Mind and Body. His life is a walking testimony of this very thing, and that's what the Y is all about. The YMCA is blessed to have Tinsley with us as part of our community. Thank you Tinsley for your resiliency and ability to see the blessings through it all!

BIGGEST HEART

A few years ago, while rehabilitating from COVID complications, Elise Motz saw the kind of community that happens at the YMCA. It was during her outpatient rehabilitation over a month at the Ascension St. Vincent location that they share with our YMCA, where she observed members, staff, and volunteers thriving in a community that valued each other

deeply. She recovered well and started working out at the YMCA soon after. Elise commented about that time, "I thought to myself, 'I want to work here and experience that."

Two weeks into being on staff at the YMCA, she was in the right place at the right time, for a purpose. She heard a call for help and was the first to respond when member Tinsley Northington fell during his workout, experiencing cardiac arrest. Over 15 minutes or so, she, along with other staff who came to help, proved the value they placed on Tinsley and succeeded in saving his life. First responders, after getting Tinsley stabilized, remarked that the actions Elise took immediately on his behalf, saved him. They would even call back later to make sure we understood what a great job she and our team did that day.

Motz said, "I believe that everyone here serves a purpose and things happen for a reason."

Later in 2023, Elise would be given the Red Cross Life Saving Award for the way she responded that day.

Asked what she would want anyone to know about why she's at the YMCA, she says, "We're a family gym. We aren't here to just work out and leave. We care about everyone's life and have a genuine community. My situation is a prime example of that."

Staff in our Before & After School Child Care programs do a wonderful job of providing and safe and enriching space for children in the Before and After School program. They provide physical activity, homework help, academic enrichment, leadership development and much more.

There are times, though, when we are called to be, and do, more. "Lily", a bright and energetic ten-year-old and a participant in our Sharon Elementary program, had her world turned upside down when her father unexpectedly passed away 3 months ago.

The loss left Lily and her mother devastated. Now a single parent, Lily's mother now faces the challenges of

raising Lily on her own while dealing with the grief that weighed heavily on both their hearts. This family needs support and the child care staff at Sharon Elementary are doing their best to provide that support. A simple question each day asking how her day is going, homework help so Lily's mother doesn't have to tend to that at home, a safe place for Lily to be during hours when her mother works and a routine that Lily is familiar with are all very important in helping Lily heal and grow. One of Lily's favorite things to do with her father was to watch the Chicago Bears. Lily wears Bears gear once per week in his honor and our staff always make sure to comment on and ask how their team is doing.

While we cannot understand the pain that Lily carries, we are determined to provide her with a supportive and nurturing environment where she can feel surrounded by people who care for her. Faith, the Site Director, shared that "our number one goal as counselors is to make sure Lily knows that she has a family at school if she ever needs us. We're always willing to hear her out and talk through whatever is on her mind."

Lily's mother mentioned that she felt like the "Before & After School program was a great program before this tragedy, but now, she does not know what she would do without this program and the support that it offers both she and Lily." She followed up with her feeling that the child care staff "have been amazing in the way that they have gone above and beyond" in supporting their family.

MOST LIKELY TO CHANGE THE WORLD

YMCA programs help young people grow and thrive to become the next great leaders driving change and shaping our community. The YMCA of Southwestern Indiana continues to host the largest delegation of Indiana Youth in Government in the state.

Every March, as part of the YMCA Youth in Government program, youth from around the state gather to literally take over Indiana's State House for three days to debate bills they have written, make oral arguments about court cases they have studied, and compete in elections to see who will hold leadership positions the next year. The YMCA is the only youth organization entrusted with such a unique experience.

For decades, our YMCA has ensured that democracy is learned by every generation. The program isn't just a multi-day, weekend conference. Students spend six months learning the legislative and judicial process, preparing their written bills with the help of local politicians, forming oral arguments with attorneys who mentor them on the merits of a court case, and (for most of them) working hard to conquer the fear of public speaking so they can run for an elected office position.

Last year's Speaker of the House, Kerry Ao went on to be selected as part of the United States Senate Youth Program, of which only two students from each state are selected to participate. While Speaker of the House, Kerry served on our Metropolitan Board of Directors as a Youth member with full voting rights, a seat now occupied by Lt. Governor, Ava Olomajeye. Kerry was also voted to Forbes 30 Under 30 for the development of his company Intertwined, an educational platform that teaches students financial literacy, which we now use at the CenterPoint Energy YMCA to teach financial literacy to the youth.



One of our 2022 military campers had significant behavior issues – struggled with listening to counselors, making friends, and expressing his anger in an appropriate way. Although we worked with him throughout the week with interventions and heightened supervision, we ultimately had to send him home early for his own safety and the safety of others.

In 2023, his mom called saying he wanted to come back for a second year. We worked with his mother to understand and make camp a great experience for him. We learned that he was on the spectrum and had challenges with male authority figures. We also learned that his father had died while serving in the military.

With this knowledge, we planned interventions, strategies, and activities to help him cope with his triggers. This allowed us to really give him the Camp experience he needed and deserved. In this camper, we found a kid that was longing for acceptance and had so much love to give. We found a more appropriate age group for cabin mates, and he made friends more easily. He loved Arts & Crafts, and he loved making crafts for any counselor or camper who had shown him kindness.

Each week, our closing campfire celebration has campers take a small twig and toss it into the fire to symbolize something they can do to make the world a brighter place. As more twigs go into the fire, the fire's light grows and grows. We invite campers to speak about their week of camp, to say thank yous, or why camp was impactful. This year, he sat in front of 200+ campers and staff and shared how accepted he felt, how many friends he made, and how much he appreciated camp. At the end of the ceremony, he walked up to Ryan, our Program Director, and said that he made one more special bracelet at camp — the beads spelled "DAD". He asked Ryan if he could get it to his dad. So Ryan and the camper talked about praying

for his Dad, and they threw the bracelet in the fire, so it would reach his dad in Heaven.

With understanding, planning, and patience, a camper transformation is not only possible, but life-changing for all involved. On Friday as campers were leaving, nearly every child walked over to say goodbye to him.



MOST LIKELY TO CAPTURE YOUR HEART

My little girl turned seven this year and we wanted to have a party for her that included swimming since she spent a part of the summer in a cast with a broken elbow. That's not the only thing going on with my little girl though.

She has had a low-grade glioma tumor in her brain stem. We found it when she was three and due to this tumor being where it is, there isn't much that can be done. By the grace of God, it hasn't affected her and the only thing we've had to do is put in a shunt to drain the fluid off her brain, due to the tumor. Right before my sweet girl's birthday, we found out that the tumor is growing. We were devastated.

After sharing our story, the YMCA went above and beyond to make my little girl's birthday special. This wasn't just us coming in and having a birthday party at a location. The Y made us feel like we were all family. Ella had a great time! The party room was perfect and so was the swimming afterward. All in one location and I can't say enough about the staff.

The YMCA has a reputation of being a Christian established gym and they lived up to that standard. The Word says in Mark 11:24, "Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them."

And with that said, I pray and claim healing for my little girl. I thank God that He is a miracle worker. I want to thank everyone for making such a special birthday for my girl.

20 years of tradition, dedication, and fun are all words that can be used to describe the Evansville Half Marathon. 2023 marked the 20th anniversary of the community event. Only 14 people have completed all 20 races, however, countless more have turned their love for the event into a way of giving back to the YMCA and volunteering in our community.

Dave Keller has been one such volunteer that has been involved on the planning committee since the beginning. Dave shared, "From the outset, there was a lot of enthusiasm among the race organizers. Like the YMCA in general, I feel like there is a sense of community about the Evansville Half Marathon. It is very much Evansville's race. I am proud to have been a part of it over the years. I hope it continues for many years to come."



Jennifer Wagner is also one of those 14 that signs up annually to participate, but she has also been a volunteer since 2005. In 2004 when the first race was run, Jennifer was an established Half Marathoner and signed up to be able to run in her hometown. The training program (now Team 13) began as her favorite way to socialize and over time, the people she was running with became family.

Jennifer loves being able to give back to the YMCA and encourage new runners/ walkers – which is, in part, why she volunteers. Jennifer discovered through Team 13 and the Evansville Half Marathon that running and walking is important to not only her physical health, but her mental health as well. She describes it as the "best stress relief ever!" Her whole family is more active because of the Evansville Half Marathon and she can't imagine her life without the friends she's made through running.

What began as a step in bringing first class racing to the Tri-State while generating funds to further the mission of the YMCA, has created decades of lasting impact.






INCOME » \$11,617,967
